"Homes are being built now with 20-foot-high ceilings and above, so I have a line of large architectural products designed to fill those spaces," Terry says.

For instance, Terry offers 8-foot decorative gates that have a wrought iron appearance but are extremely lightweight. They can go above a bed as the headboard or over the fireplace in a two-story room where you need something huge for the space.

"You can't usually go into a store to find these items," she says. "Generally, you have to go through an interior designer. But I'm able to bring this directly to the customer."

In addition to its online retail boutique, Dream Home Design has a small retail space inside BLACKLION, a multimerchant center for upscale home furnishings and accents. It is located at 10605 Park Rd. in Charlotte. Terry's space there specializes in furniture and accessories with an Old World flair.
